**RECOMMENDATION:**

Ratify Calaveras Consolidated Fire District Fire Ordinance 2020-1 and delegate enforcement authority to the Calaveras Consolidated Fire District Chief.

**DISCUSSION/SUMMARY:**

Health & Safety Code § 13869.7(b) mandates that a fire district provide a copy of an ordinance it is considering for possible adoption to the County within which the ordinance will apply and give the County an opportunity to provide the District with any comments. Any such written comments will become part of the District’s public hearing record at the time it adopts its ordinance.

A copy of the proposed Fire Ordinance 2020-1 was provided to the Board of Supervisors for comment on June 23, 2020. The Board did not provide written comments. Public notice of the proposed ordinance was published in the local paper on August 12 and 19, 2020. The Fire District conducted a public hearing of proposed Fire Ordinance 2020-1 on August 24, 2020. Following public comments, the Fire Ordinance was approved and adopted by the Fire District Board of Directors.

The ordinance is now before the Board of Supervisors for ratification, modification or denial. Pursuant to Health & Safety Code § 13869.7(c), the Board may ratify, modify, or deny a fire district’s adopted ordinance and transmit its determination to the District within 15 days of the determination. Any modification or denial must include a written statement describing the Board’s reasoning. The ordinance shall not be effective until the Board ratifies it, and if it is ratified, the Board shall delegate enforcement of the ordinance to either the chief of the district that adopted the ordinance, or the chief building official of the County.

**FINANCING:**

There is no financial impact associated with this item.

**ALTERNATIVES:**

The Board may choose not to hear the item. This is not recommended as the Board has already expressed its support of the item and the District Board has adopted it. The Board may also consider modifying or denying the ordinance.


