RECOMMENDATION:

1) Adopt plans and specifications for the 2019 Annual Striping Program; 2) Authorize the Director of Public Works to incorporate any final changes into the bid documents before advertising for bids; and 3) Authorize the Department of Public Works to solicit formal construction bids.

DISCUSSION/SUMMARY:

Longitudinal pavement markings such as centerline and edge line striping, improve the safety of a road by delineating the traveled way. They aid in the reduction of roadway departures as well as vehicles crossing into oncoming travel lanes. However, striping paint has a short lifetime as it wears out from car and truck tires, chains and snowplows. Rain, snow, sun and sanding material also take their toll.

Of the approximately 689 miles of roads in the “County Maintained Mileage System,” approximately 450 miles are paved with centerline and/or edge line traffic striping. In order to maintain a safe road system, the Department of Public Works (DPW) refreshes existing center line and edge line striping on an annual basis through the Annual Striping Program (Program). All County maintained roads with painted stripes are identified within the overall Program, with different portions of the system striped annually. DPW has appropriated a budget of \$200,000 for the 2019 Annual Striping Program. With the available funds, priority will be placed on restriping major and minor collectors throughout the County in Fiscal Year 2019-20.

Roadway striping is considered a minor alteration to an existing public facility. As such, the project is exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and a Notice of Exemption was filed with the County Clerk on July 1, 2019. All work will occur within the existing right of way.

As required by Public Contract Code §22039, the Board shall adopt plans and specifications for all public projects. Once plans and specifications are adopted by the Board of Supervisors the Project will move to the construction phase with the advertisement of the construction contract documents.

FINANCING:

There is no impact to the County General Fund.

The project will be funded through Calaveras County Road Fund. Necessary budget appropriations are included in the fiscal year 2019-20 Department of Public Works – Roads and Bridges budget (10200760-5272).

ALTERNATIVES:

The Board may choose to do any of the following:

1. Support the Department's recommendation;
2. Continue the item to another date for further consideration. This action is not recommended unless the Board specifically requests additional information which cannot be obtained during this meeting; or,
3. Deny the request. This is not recommended, as this work is necessary for public safety.


